Regional Highlights

OTTAWA September 13, 2010 - **Françoise Sullivan RCA** and **Robert Jekyll RCA** were each distinguished with high honours from The Canadian Conference for the Arts, in Ottawa.

Françoise Sullivan received the **Diplôme d'honneur**, while Robert Jekyll was awarded the **Keith Kelly Award for Cultural Leadership**.

The winners were presented with their awards during the CCA's 65th anniversary Gala dinner, which took place on November 1, 2010 at the National Arts Centre (NAC) in Ottawa.

The Diplôme d'honneur is presented annually in recognition of a sustained contribution to the cultural life of the country, whether through volunteer activity, mentoring, patronage, individual arts practice or other recognized support.

The Keith Kelly Award for Cultural Leadership is presented to a Canadian who has made a significant contribution to the arts through advocacy work or the development of cultural policy, or who has otherwise demonstrated leadership in the field.

Ann McCall RCA has won a prize at the **Ottawa International Biennale of Miniature Art**. The image was selected for the catalogue, posters and invitation.

Ms. McCall was also selected from participating artists in the **24th International Print Biennale** in Sarcelles, France to exhibit currently at the Centre d'expositions, Repentigny, QC. (see inset image)

MONTREAL November 9th 2010 - **William (Bill) Vazan RCA**, was awarded the **Prix Paul-Émile Borduas**, the highest distinction awarded by the Government of Quebec in the visual arts, design, architecture & craft arts. Considered as a mainstay of conceptual art, land art and photographic montage in Quebec, Vazan has produced monumental works and made a lot of permanent and ephemeral interventions in nature, parks and public spaces. His work has been widely exhibited in North America and abroad.

Vazan lives and works in Montreal since 1957. He currently teaches at the School of Visual and Media Arts of the University of Quebec at Montreal.

Montréal (STM) and the Régie autonome des transport parisiens (RATP), her artwork *La Voix lactée* (The Milky Way) will be unveiled in the subway in October 2011.

The artwork will be composed of a glass mosaic & will occupy the entire surface of the inner corridor that links an underground mezzanine.

Cadieux was also a recipient of the 2007 Pratt & Whitney Canada Award from the Grand Prix du Conseil des Arts de Montréal.

EAST COAST July 2010 - **Marlene Creates RCA** launched a major internet project, *A Virtual Walk of the Boreal Poetry Garden*. The project is based on the six acres of boreal forest where she lives in Portugal Cove, NL.

In April 2010, she received an Arts and Letters Award for her poetry from the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador.

VANCOUVER Glenn Lewis's exhibition of work from the 60s at Presentation House Gallery demonstrates his important contributions to West Coast Conceptualism. The Morris and Helen Belkin Gallery (UBC), PHG and Museum of Anthropology share the new Satellite Gallery at 560 Seymour, supported by the Michael O'Brian Family Foundation.

Christina Ritchie has left the CAG after a successful ten years and following her will be Nigel Pierce from Birmingham's ICONS gallery. Melanie O'Brian is leaving Artspeak and heading to the Power Plant. Hank Bull is leaving Centre A after ten years of building the gallery into a vital downtown eastside space.

MANITOBA **Grace Nickel RCA**, assistant professor in ceramics at the University of Manitoba School of Art, has been awarded the commission for *"Donors' Forest,"* her submission to the national competition for the Beechwood National Cemetery of Canada in Ottawa.

She created the commemorative piece for the entranceway to the new Beechwood National Memorial Centre. *'Donors' Forest'* pays homage to the giving spirit of the donors, while at the same time remembering the brave spirits of those who have gone before us.

The clay sculpture was unveiled September 16, 2010.

TORONTO November 4, 2010 - **Naoko Matsubara RCA**, master printmaker, has been bestowed the **Distinguished Achievement Award** from Carnegie Mellon University, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Only two of these prestigious awards are given annually from all disciplines of the University competing. Ms Matsubara has lived in Canada for 40 years and has had exhibitions at the Museum of Fine Art, Boston, Yale University Art Gallery, Library of Congress in Washington DC including 20 published books and portfolios in USA, Japan and Canada.

November 6 - 18, 2010. *'Voyages'*, an exhibition of new paintings by **Ron Bolt RCA**, Loch Gallery, Toronto. In this 4th exhibition of paintings at the Loch Gallery, the works record memories of travels Bolt has done over the years.

Eight different locations act as his source of inspiration: Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Ontario, the Yukon, Alaska, the Caribbean, Ireland and the Cote d'Azur in France.

Ron Bolt was born in Toronto, Ontario and enjoys a career that spans forty years and includes more than 60 one-man exhibitions from coast to coast.

Apian Screen II is the third architectural installation in the series of beeswax rooms which explores the beehive metaphor in utopian architecture. In this version over 6000 high relief beeswax tiles have been carefully placed on the walls, floor to ceiling at the Albright Knox Gallery, to create an imaginary landscape or cityscape.

February 19 to May 15, 2011 - McMichael Collection, Kleinberg *Marilyn in Canada* features photographs, paintings, sculpture, and prints by artists who have inscribed Monroe's public image with their own culturally-filtered interpretations which also serve as commentary on the influence of American popular culture in Canada.

One such connection includes works by **George S. Zimbel RCA**, an American photographer who immigrated to Canada in 1971. He participated in the original photo session with Marilyn Monroe that was staged in 1954 during the filming of *The Seven Year Itch*.

The RCA Programme Fund celebrates the excellence of its members by arranging regional, provincial or national exhibitions in various disciplines in different locations across the country. It can also fund special projects.

March 6, 1880

The Governor General, the Marquis of Lorne, inaugurated the first official exhibition of the RCA and launched the National Gallery of Canada at the Clarendon Hotel in Ottawa. Each Academician deposited a work with the Canadian Government to form the nucleus of the new Gallery's collection

In 1973 the Academy abolished the Associate status in favour of Full status for all members.
